There are eight categories of Identity Theft. Stolen information can be obtained from:

*Tax returns*

*Social security cards*

*Medical cards/records*

*Driver's licenses*

*Financial records*

*Criminal records*

*Your child or grandchild*

*Social media*

She recommended not carrying these records with you, if at all possible. Try to hide your card/records when they are needed. Ignore suspicious e-mails. Hit the "clear" button on the machine when getting your gas. Never give out information over the phone. Other ID theft information is available in attachments to these minutes.
