Travis informed us that they have contacts with MADD and human trafficking. Dan mentioned a spokesperson from a bank to speak about scams, fraud, etc.

Bill Fitzpatrick asked if we could possibly have a commander from Randolph. The Treasurer suggested SWAT as a future speaker. Gary suggested having a speaker every other month and having a 30 minutes meeting so that the speaker may end the meeting.

Business Members

Tom stated that the business members started in 2009 with a \$100 donation. An associate sponsor would donate less than \$100. They used to send letters to solicit the businesses and that seemed to produce the best results. We are now down to 16 businesses some of which have been with us for 10 years. We are only getting 6 to 7% of businesses and it should be at least 10%. They want to start preparing the letters on the 1st of April and will send out after April 15th. Camo Energy has donated \$1000 each year and \$2000 for Blue Santa. He will prepare the information on talking points for soliciting businesses. The website shows the equipment bought from donations. 100% goes to the Police Department. He is working on getting an updated business list from the city.

The gun raffle will be started the end of April or 1st of May and it will continue for 3 months. It will run from May into August.

Police Report

Det. Travis informed us that skimmers were traced and one recovered. Skimmers take your number. They use a pin-size hole to obtain information. It was suggested to change your PIN occasionally and to watch your credit card information. Contact Police if you have found a skimmer.

Individuals were followed from RBFCU and then robbed. They have video but it is grainy. They will pass the information to another agency.

The shootings are still being worked and they are closing in on groups. They are not from UC. SAPD has made some arrests. The suspects are Cibolo students from Steele and Clemens. Det. Travis will check to see if photos of gang members can be distributed to our members. Gangs were robbing other gang members for drugs. There was a death in District 4. A male individual who was an alcoholic fell and hit his head and unfortunately could not be saved.

Det. Travis stated that Sgt. Carmona will speak about the Robinson scene at the next CPA meeting on April 18.

UC had over 200 DWI's last year so Det. Travis will contact someone from MADD to be a possible future speaker. He will also try to get Texas Ranger Keith Pauska.

Next Meeting

The meeting will be at UC Public Works Building on April 17, 2019.
