Police Report

Detective Anthony Travis said there was a robbery at the Lucky Spin legal gambling facility. An employee was held at gunpoint and there was 1 gunshot. Sgt. Carmona received information from Crime Stoppers.

There was a shooting on Galicia. Det. Travis believes it was in retaliation from an incident last month. 23 shots were fired and targeted 1 house. Nobody was injured and the suspects drove away. None of the Ring Doorbells in the area captured any information. They are still working the case. They will be charged with a deadly conduct charge. They have no leads.

They were 2 chases that included stolen vehicles. Converse issued a stolen vehicle. Officers approached the vehicle and the suspect drove away. They parked the vehicle in the Forum and the suspect ran. He was caught on camera and they know who the suspect is. He has parole warrants. The vehicle was impounded at Johnny's. The suspect's Mom told on him.

Fraud is on the rise. \$24000 worth of gift cards were purchased online. Suspects are also putting their own bar code on the gift cards.

A young male was issued a citation of assault by threats after he said he would have shot the woman who cut him off if he didn't have his kids in the car. He was also involved in another case stating that he had a gun.

A man was thrown out of his vehicle and run over in another road rage incident which occurred on 1604.

Fake \$50 were discovered which had motion picture use only printed on them.

The FBI and 8 Officers were involved in an investigation at Coronado and Desoto. A former CPA member at some point had made comments that were believed to be domestic terrorism. This individual like to complain about Officers.

A stash house was discovered that contained drugs, money, and guns. SAPD got involved. Some arrests were made.

Brenda Hester suggested that someone bring the Police blotter to the next meeting.
