## **Police Report**

Detective Anthony Travis was said there were skimmers found about 3 weeks ago. The Banks receive transactions that are unusual, and they notify the Police.

There was a robbery victim that was shot in the chest then he shot himself in the leg. The girlfriend dropped him at the hospital then came back to U.C. The victim had stolen his Mom's gun and the victim wants victim compensation.

A sexual assault case was closed. The alleged victim had gone to the hospital so many times for sexual assault, she had 20 plus outcries. The victim said it happened at the hospital chapel. Det. Travis stated she is homeless and may have a mental illness. A Bexar County false report must be proven and in 90% of the cases they can't locate the victims. Many of them are juveniles or from adoption homes. In most cases they cannot locate the witness.

A 50 -year old U.C. citizen committed suicide by shooting himself. He opened all the windows to his house and left a note. The mailman found the victim in his house after noticing that the mailbox had not been emptied. The victim had no contacts listed. Det. Travis said that the Police can do welfare checks and to keep an eye on your neighbors.
